A little about Vidalia onions—they can only be grown in certain areas, and ours come from Georgia. The grower raises these specifically for the Shriners. If stored properly—each onion wrapped in paper (newspaper works well) so they do not touch and kept in a cool, dry place—they can last for months. They can also be chopped, sealed in a bag with a little water, and frozen.

If you missed ordering, we plan to have a limited number of bags available first come, first served on pickup day at the Shrine. The pickup date will be announced once we receive the delivery schedule.

The Arbor Shrine Club parade schedule has not yet been released, but the first parade is usually Arbor Day in Nebraska City sometime in April. Watch for emails with dates and times.

PROVOST

The Tangier Provost Unit was organized in 1954 at the request of the Imperial Potentate to form a unit of law-enforcement Nobles providing security at Shrine functions. Tangier Potentate J.H. McAlpin appointed Noble Martin Jensen, a Captain with the Omaha Police Division, as the first Captain of the Tangier Provost Guard (later shortened to Provost). The first officers with Jensen were Patrolman Paul Slinkerd and Sergeant Elmer Deman.

For many years, membership was limited to active-duty Omaha Police officers but was later expanded to sworn law enforcement from surrounding jurisdictions.

In 1980, the Tangier Deputies motorcycle escort unit merged with the Provost, increasing mobility and capability. The unit also implemented an FCC-licensed four-frequency communications system to coordinate events throughout the Central States Shrine Association area.

In 1981, under Provost Chief Frank Vondra and by order of Potentate Walter Powell, the bylaws were amended to allow any Noble in good standing to join, expanding membership beyond law enforcement.

Today, the Tangier Provost continues its original mission—providing security for the Shrine Center and grounds, assisting with parade traffic control, and supporting the Potentate and Divan. Recognized by their distinctive uniforms, Provost Nobles serve with honor and integrity in support of the children of Shriners Hospitals.

From the Office of the Imperial Recorder

When the members of a Shrine Temple elect a Noble to the office of Oriental Guide, they are virtually starting that Noble through the Divan line on the assumption that he will prove qualified for any merit achievement to the high office of Potentate.

Hence, it's quite evident that the nominations for Oriental Guide should be based upon thorough and accurate evaluation of character, ability, and interest.

A Noble can be a good fellow, a hard worker, and a loyal Shriner...and yet lack the basic qualifications which make a good Potentate. Unless a Noble is fully qualified for the job, he is unfair both to himself and to his temple in seeking the office or in permitting his fellow nobles to support and promote his candidacy.

The normal starting point of Shrine leadership is the office of Oriental Guide. The following checklist may prove helpful in evaluating potential candidates for the office of Oriental Guide. However, no thinking man would be so naïve or presumptuous as to all the virtues, talents, and qualifications which are set forth in this checklist for advance evaluation of potential candidates by the voting members.

Many temples have placed a definite limitation upon their progress as a result of hasty judgment in connection with nominations for the office of Oriental Guide. Every Noble is not fitted to meet the rigorous demands imposed upon Potentates.

So let's be fair, honest, and wise in the all-important matter of electing to office only men who are eminently qualified for the job and financially secure. We all know that with honor comes responsibility. And while there is high honor associated with a Divan office, the ensuing responsibilities entail a lot of time-consuming, energy-consuming WORK! Eternal vigilance must be wisely and thoughtfully exercised by the voting membership in order to perpetuate a high caliber of leadership!
