


Q&A With Potentate Paul Bohannon

As Potentate Paul Bohannon's term comes to a close, he reflects on his year of service, sharing insights, accomplishments, and thoughts on leadership, fellowship, and the future of Tangier Shrine.

Q: As your term as Potentate comes to a close, how does it feel looking back on 2025?

A: It's truly a mix of emotions. There's a sense of relief as the responsibilities of leadership are passed on, but also a deep sense of gratitude and nostalgia. Serving as Potentate has been an incredible honor, and I will genuinely miss being part of the Divan and working alongside so many dedicated Nobles who give tirelessly to Tangier. The friendships, shared experiences, and moments of fellowship this year will stay with me always.



Q: When you began your year, what were your main goals or visions for the Temple?

A: From the outset, my focus was twofold: to strengthen membership and to maintain a balanced budget. Membership growth is the lifeblood of our organization, and financial stability ensures that we can continue to support our Shriners' mission and community initiatives. I wanted to create an environment where our Nobles feel valued, involved, and excited to participate in all the wonderful activities Tangier offers.



Q: What accomplishments or milestones are you most proud of from your year as Potentate?

A: There are so many moments that stand out. We unveiled a new elevator, significantly improving accessibility for everyone who comes through our doors—this is a lasting improvement that benefits our community. I was thrilled to see increased Noble participation in events and fundraisers, which really brought our Temple together. Q: What advice would you give to the incoming 2026 Potentate as he begins his journey?

A: Chief Rabban Terry Nelson is a phenomenal leader, planner, and organizer. He has a remarkable ability to motivate Nobles and bring out their best. My advice is to stay visible, lead with passion, and continue fostering fellowship, while always keeping the mission of Shriners and the joy of our events at the forefront.



Q: What has this experience taught you personally — about leadership, about service, or about yourself?

A: I've learned that effective leadership requires visibility, participation, and recognition. A Potentate should celebrate the efforts of others, be present at events, and enjoy the journey. Most importantly, leadership is about service—not just guiding the Temple, but ensuring every Noble feels included, appreciated, and inspired.

Q: Any final message you'd like to share with the Nobility and Ladies as you pass the gavel?

A: Thank you to everyone who gave their time, energy, and hearts to Tangier this year. Your dedication makes all the difference. As we look ahead, we will continue to need your presence, your support, and your enthusiasm to grow membership and spread awareness. Imperial & CSSA Representatives Trustee: One 4 Year Term and One 1 Year Term

Tangier Shrine will elect seven Divan members, a Trustee for a four-year term, Representatives to the Imperial Council and Central States Shrine Association, and any openings which may occur in the interim.

Members must have their 2025 dues paid for admission to this meeting

FROM IMPERIAL BY-LAWS (IOWA CORPORATION) Article 25

When Elected: Each Temple must elect its Officers and Representatives at its annual meeting in January unless its bylaws allow the election to occur at the temple's stated meeting in December.

325.5 Ballot: Election of officers shall be by separate written ballot and by a majority vote of those present and voting. A blanket ballot is prohibited.

325.6 Time of Election: Nominations must commence no later than 9:00 p.m. and when that hour arrives all other business must cease and none may be transacted until the election is concluded.

325.7 Other Officers: The Temple may elect such other officers as its Bylaws provide.

325.8 Nominations: Candidates for office and Representatives must be placed in nomination from the floor.

325.10 Representatives:

- (a) Where a Temple elects more than one Representative, all candidates must be balloted for on one written ballot.
- (b) Each member voting must vote only for the total number of Representatives to be elected, otherwise his ballot cannot be counted as a vote.
- (c) A majority of those present and voting is necessary to elect each Representative.
- (d) Only those candidates who receive a majority vote shall be declared elected.
- (e) Successive written ballots must then be taken in the same manner on other candidates until all Representatives are elected.
- (f) If more candidates receive a majority vote than the number of Representatives to be elected, then those receiving the greatest number of votes shall be declared elected.
- (g) Blank ballots or ballots containing any markings other than the name of a candidate nominated from the floor are not votes and are not to be considered for any purpose.

325.11 Election Regulations:

- (a) A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a resume consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.
- (b) The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.
- (c) For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.
- (d) At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.



Tangier Tales

Tangier Shrine enjoyed many successes this year! Each of those successes was born out of your dedication, commitment and engagement. Once again, you showed up and gave of your time and resources – both financially and otherwise! As 2025 comes to a close, I would like to thank each Noble and Lady for serving Tangier Shrine unselfishly.



The article below was published in the November 1950 Hot Sands. It reminds me of what I found upon joining Tangier Shrine. It should also serve as a tool for us all, as we seek to grow Tangier Shrine and bring new Nobles to our fraternity and what we believe to be the greatest philanthropy. As always, I did not edit the author's original work.

Ten Good Reasons for Joining the Shrine

1. *Because the Shrine is the climax of Masonry, socially. To enjoy all that Masonry can give, you need the Shrine.*
2. *Because the Shrine is the most dramatic evidence on the American continent that there is more enjoyment in giving than receiving – by permitting your participation in the helping of crippled children.*
3. *Because you need the influence of smiling little children – helped by you – to make you a bigger man.*
4. *Because you need to forget yourself – often and completely. The Shrine will enable you to cut loose from yourself and play when you need it most.*
5. *Because the Shriners are all human guys, one with another. If you are a Shriner, you can lock arms with any Shriner anywhere – any place – and together you can share a type of fraternity that is possessed by no other organization in the world.*
6. *Because in the Shrine you will find that no man is big and no man is small. That you will profit from the contact and inspiration of the man who is worldly successful – and equally from the man who is the more likeable because he is human.*
7. *Because the Shrine is the most modern idea in fraternalism. The Shrine worships no history. It deals in no postmortems. It looks to the opportunity now to do the world's work of to-day and the great chance of tomorrow.*
8. *Because Shriner's wait for no senseless formalities – play no superficial isms. The Shriner from the West will be the close friend of the Shriner from the East, whom he has never seen before, in less than a dozen split seconds.*
9. *Because when a Shriner shakes hands with another Noble, he means it. A Noble is a Noble to every other Noble on sight or until he is proven otherwise, which seldom happens.*
10. *Because America needs the Shrine – Shriners – and everything that the Shrine stands for and does. You will be a happier man and more useful citizen – a better parent and a more intelligent churchman as a Shriner – and more people will know you and be happier for your smile – when you are a Noble of the Ancient Arabic Order of nobles of the Mystic Shrine.*


