Please keep Gary and Ann Churchill's family on your prayers and thoughts on the passing of his 92 year old mother.







Burn Awareness Week Kicks Off Annual Burn Prevention Campaign

Shriners Hospitals for Children® continues to work to decrease the number of preventable pediatric burn injuries by raising awareness, and promotes burn awareness and prevention year-round. One program in this effort is the annual Burn Awareness campaign, which began more than 20 years ago.

Every year, during the first full week of February, our public relations efforts emphasize Burn Awareness Week, the kickoff of a yearlong educational campaign aimed at burn awareness and prevention, including offering free educational materials via our website. The items, including activity books and fact sheets, are designed to be a resource for firefighters, teachers, parents and others concerned with the safety and well-being of children.

Shriners Hospitals Wants Children and Families to "Be Burn Aware"

The 2018 Burn Awareness Week will take place Feb. 4-10. We are once again using the theme "Be Burn Aware," and focusing on preventing burn injuries in the home, because the vast majority of preventable burn injuries continue to occur in residences. Homes are the sites of thousands of burn injuries to children every year, including scalds, fire-related injuries, and even electrical burns. Many of these incidents could have been easily prevented by following and implementing some basic safety tips.

These educational efforts do have an impact; in the U.S., the occurrence of major pediatric burn injuries has decreased.

"Shriners Hospitals for Children works year-round to promote burn awareness by providing education



to help prevent burn injuries," said Kenneth Guidera, M.D., chief medical officer of Shriners Hospitals for Children.

"Our campaign this year, 'Be Burn Aware,' will again focus on teaching children and families ways they can stay safe and avoid burn injuries. Knowing that many of these pediatric burn injuries are preventable, Shriners Hospitals hopes to reduce their occurrences by increasing awareness."

Educational Materials Emphasize Burn Awareness and Prevention

The campaign features two child-friendly characters, Boots and Brewster – a caped, cuddly bear and a googly-eyed teapot – who are featured in activity books for children ages 3-7 and 8-12, available in English, Spanish and French. The entertaining duo leads children through the various rooms of a house, pointing out dangers, and how to easily correct or avoid them. The coloring pages, word searches, cartoons and other activities are designed to grab children's attention and present the information in a memorable, age-appropriate manner. The campaign also includes various tip sheets and fact cards that emphasize the prevention of scalds, fire-related and electrical burns.





Gaining a Greater Understanding of Complex Orthopaedic Conditions



Our in-house research teams include renowned experts whose discoveries have changed treatment methodologies and improved the lives of countless children coping with debilitating conditions. Shriners Hospitals for Children® is committed to the pursuit of knowledge that improves medical care.

Research with the Potential to Change Lives Here are some examples of ongoing efforts related to orthopaedics at our official research centers:

- Researchers at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Canada have made many discoveries related to the treatment of osteogenesis imperfecta (OI), as well as its genetic cause. OI is a hereditable connective tissue disorder that is mainly characterized by bone fragility. Researchers at our Canada location have contributed to the understanding that, in the majority of patients, OI is caused by mutations in the two genes that encode collagen, the primary building block of bones. One aspect of current research focuses on the disease-causing mutation in OI type V.
- At Shriners Hospitals for Children Northern California, Diana Farmer, M.D., is working hard to correct spina bifida and other fetal malformations before birth through the use of in-utero surgery and examining stem cell grafts in experimental models. In addition, Laura Borodinsky, Ph.D., recently obtained novel evidence that folate increases the ability of cells on the two sides of the spinal cord to fuse together to prevent spina bifida, which explains why adding folic acid to the maternal diet diminishes the frequency of spina bifida. Also, Michelle James, M.D., chief of orthopaedics, is developing new tests and procedures to enhance functional recovery

- from hand malformations and injuries. If successful, Dr. James' studies will help children who have congenital thumb problems be better able to grip objects.
- The research team at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Philadelphia is dedicated to clinical and laboratory research that advances scientific knowledge around the prevention and treatment of mobility issues resulting from injury or disease affecting the brain. Under the leadership of Peter Crino, M.D., Ph.D., the Brain Development and Plasticity team is making strides in understanding the causes of cerebral palsy (CP) and developing therapies for its prevention and treatment. Laura Goetzl, M.D., is researching the maternal factors that cross the placenta and cause the fetus to develop CP. Once fully developed, these tests can be used to pinpoint the timing of in-utero brain injury that leads to CP, and potentially to monitor the effects of in-utero treatments to reduce brain injury. Tanya Ferguson, Ph.D., is also testing a drug that could be given to pregnant women who experience an episode that puts their baby at risk for CP. And, Sam Lee, Ph.D., is using advanced muscle-stimulating techniques combined with physical therapy to help children with CP improve their ability to use a tricycle for fun and aerobic conditioning.

Committed to Our Mission of Improving Lives

These are just a few of the many studies being conducted at our research centers that will, hopefully, lead to improved lives and improved treatments for children coping with a wide range of orthopaedic conditions. We are proud of the work being done throughout the Shriners Hospitals for Children health care system to add to the worldwide body of medical knowledge and change lives.

Leaders in Research Related to Burn Injuries

Shriners Hospitals for Children® has made major contributions to the worldwide body of medical knowledge that have both led to new medical protocols and treatments and improved the lives of countless people throughout the world. Our research efforts focus on our four service lines: orthopaedics, burns, spinal cord injury and cleft lip and palate.

Our health care system has been a leader in burn research for decades. Here is a look at research efforts underway at our research centers that focus on understanding the impact and implications of severe burns in order to enhance and improve treatments for these complex injuries.

Turning Discoveries into Therapies

The multidisciplinary research activities at the Shriners Hospitals for Children — Boston research center are at the forefront of innovation in regenerative medicine and stem cells, wound healing, metabolism, nanotechnology and microfluidics, and immunology/inflammation/infection to advance the health of injured and sick children. The research program focuses on academic discoveries, and transforming promising discoveries into therapies, devices, and diagnostics.

Advancing Clinical Care

The continuing themes of the Shriners Hospitals for Children — Cincinnati research center are wound healing, immunology, inflammation, infection and nutrition, all of which play critical roles in recovery from burn injury.

Since its establishment nearly 50 years ago, the efforts of the Cincinnati hospital's research department have resulted in major advances in clinical care of burn and trauma patients throughout the world. For example, several recent analyses have shown that when the diets developed at the Cincinnati Shriners Hospital are used in patients with burn injuries undergoing major operations, the incidence of wound infection is decreased by close to 50 percent and hospitalization is decreased by approximately three days. These two major advances in the care of children with burn injuries have resulted in almost uniform survival of children with extensive burn injuries treated at the Cincinnati hospital over the last several years.

The Importance of Data and Evaluation

Since the 1960s, researchers at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Galveston have improved care for severe burn injuries through their contributions in six core research areas: cardiopulmonary injury, metabolism, immunology and sepsis, molecular



physiology responses, exercise/rehabilitation and psychosocial support of burn survivors.

The most recent significant research outcomes include the improvement in models of measurement of protein, fat and skin metabolism, as well as in the evaluation and identification of scarring post burn injury.


Over the past year, researchers at our Northern California location have improved emergency management of children with severe burns, written an innovative burn nursing handbook, and learned how to optimize the treatment of children with burn injuries on the basis of differences in genes they inherited.

Progress that has been made through clinical research includes the discovery of glucose and insulin metabolism changes post burn, improvement in evaluation and treatment of inhalation injuries, and an understanding of the use of virtual reality methods during rehabilitation interventions and wound management.

A Commitment to Improving Lives

All of our researchers are dedicated to discovering answers to complex medical questions and developing new treatment strategies. The researchers do so with the goal of improving the care, treatment, and quality of life of our patients, and of other burn survivors throughout the world.


