Though the 2009 ZR1 came close with a quarter mile at 11.4 seconds, the old prototype still reigns supreme; The original 1953 Corvette offered only two options – a heater for \$91.00 and an AM radio for \$145.00. A Corvette with all the trimmings would set you back a total of \$3,749.

FANGIER "HOT SANDS"



As of 2022, Nebraska was number eleven on the list of states with the most counties within its borders. Fillmore, named after U.S. President Millard Fillmore, is one of the 93 counties found in the state of Nebraska.

It was in Fillmore County on March 5, 1880, Frank and Harriet (McLeod) Dorrance welcomed William Henry Dorrance Sr. to the family. The couple would add five additional children to the family over the next fifteen years. Sadly, two of their six children would not survive to adulthood. Frank Dorrance was born in Michigan and Harriet McLeod was born in Canada. The two married in Geneva, Nebraska August 23, 1879.

The 1900 Census finds Frank, Harriet and 2 of the children living on a farm in Sarpy County Nebraska. William seems to have been driven and desirous of a life away from the farm. In 1898 William left his family of origin to embark on his journey toward adulthood. W.H. or "Bill", as he was also called, moved to Omaha to attend commercial college. By all accounts, he was fearless and had a personal code that guided him. Once, he found himself present at an Omaha drug store during a holdup. The bandit ran about two blocks before he was tackled. It was William that gave chase and made the apprehension? This will become a theme we revisit later.

While pursuing his education, Bill worked as a messenger "carrying papers", washing dishes in a restaurant for his meals and "sitting up with corpses" at a local mortuary. Whether he accepted this undertaking out of necessity; or the decision was purposeful, this decision, and a man named Edwin F. Brailey, would significantly impact the direction Bill's life would take.

In 1900, at age 20, William can be found working as a stenographer in the offices of the superintendent of the U.P.R.R. He moved up quicky, and by the fall of that year was promoted to timekeeper of train and engine men. William was approaching age 21 when he determined the time had come to establish himself in business. Success or failure would depend upon his own talents and energies and not those for whom, or with whom, he was employed. He had met Edwin Brailey and while "sitting up with corpses" had studied embalming. The next step appears to have been clear. On July 1, 1901; William Dorrance and Edwin Brailey formed a partnership that would be known as the firm of Brailey and Dorrance, Funeral Directors, with parlors at Cuming and Twentieth Streets. There were various funeral directors in Omaha during this time, but Brailey and Dorrance were enjoying success and by 1907 had built a new two-story brick structure on the corner of Nineteenth and Cuming streets.

Edwin Brailey wasn't the only individual that had made an impression upon Bill. A certain Miss Mae M. Robinson had become an important part of Bill's life after he moved to Omaha. He and Mae were married in the parlor of her parent's home at 715 First Avenue in Council Bluffs Iowa on November 27, 1902. Bill and Mae would welcome at least two children into their family, William Henry Dorrance Jr. in 1905 and Gretchen Angeline Dorrance in 1907.

Though Bill and Mae enjoyed a successful 48-year marriage; their lives, like so many now, and many at the time, would be inextricably marred by tragedy. Forest Lawn Cemetery records show an infant child of 3 days, born in 1903, and buried in the family plot, was likely the child of William and Mae. Harriet Dorrance, Bills' mother, had contracted Typhoid Fever that led to Consumption. She passed away May 26, 1904, at age 41. In 1908; on a business trip Near Falls City Nebraska, Mae's father, George A. Robinson, fell from an automobile he was driving and was killed instantly at age 62. In 1910, five-year-old William and 3-year-old Gretchen Dorrance were playing near the furnace in the basement of the family home at 2780 Central Boulevard. Paper was lit and a fire quickly spread. Though both children were rescued, Gretchen sustained injuries to her lungs from smoke and the hot gases present in the fire and it was feared she would not survive, she did. Scarlet Fever invaded the family home in 1911. It would claim William Dorrance Jr. on February 1, 1911, and his sister Gretchen, a week later, on February 8, 1911. The first nine years of their marriage had been a series of hardships, but Bill and Mae would go on.

Brailey and Dorrance continued to enjoy success serving the Omaha community, not only in business, but also in civic affairs. In 1902 Edwin Brailey was elected coroner of Douglas County and the Coroner's Office was moved from N.P. Swanson's Funeral Home at seventeenth and Cuming streets to Brailey and Dorrance Funeral Parlors. Brailey would continue as coroner until he was elected Douglas County Sheriff in 1907, serving two terms.

After the untimely death of his business partner and friend in 1922, Bill would continue Brailey and Dorrance as sole proprietor. He continued to innovate and use the latest technology. As early as August 1922, The Brailey and Dorrance Ambulance Service had been established and was in high demand. Calls from Blair, Irvington, and other communities around Omaha and western Iowa were not uncommon.

Like Brailey, Bill was civic minded. He served the Omaha community in several capacities. Bill was on the City Council and from 1935 to 1939, he served as Omaha's Fire Commissioner. In this capacity, he endeavored to ensure both equipment and manpower was sufficient to serve and meet the needs of Omaha's citizens.

Late one evening; in May 1936, after returning to his home at 402 Lincoln Boulevard, a man approached him outside his garage. "Put 'em up, old man," the robber demanded. "Like hell I'll put them up. Get the hell out of here," said Dorrance. Bill stepped over a hedge and swung at the man. The bandit swung, too, and hit Bill on the head with his gun. Bill wasn't sure if he was knocked down or tripped. The gunman, likely surprised at the resistance, ran. It seems that this was not the first encounter of this type, for Bill. It had happened before when he was out late at night. He always resisted and robbery was never successful, he stated.

After four years as Fire Commissioner, Dorrance sought, and was elected, Douglas County Sheriff. He ran on a platform to enforce both gambling and liquor laws. While campaigning, Bill declared, "I am serving notice on all operators of gambling or liquor establishments or slot machine operators now existing or with any intention of opening that they must either operate within the law or suffer the consequences."

In January 1939, Bill took over as Sheriff. His approach to the job was very much the same as his approach to his business and other civic positions held. He sought to ensure there were adequate and experienced deputies on each shift. He put his deputies through "deputies' school," a well as first aid and disaster relief training. Always wanting to bring the latest technology and innovation to his endeavors, Bill made certain his deputies had the latest equipment at their disposal. Most notably, he equipped all cars with a new and enhanced two-way frequency modulation (FM) radio system. Antennas placed strategically throughout the city and the new radios allowed for greater coverage and much more timely and efficient service to Omaha's citizens.

On November 27, 1950, Sheriff Dorrance, aged 70, underwent an abdominal operation at Clarkson Hospital, for an undisclosed illness. He came through the surgery but failed to rally. On December 6, 1950, at 6:05 p.m. at Clarkson Hospital, he laid down his working tools. He had been Sheriff since 1939 and had said he would not seek re-election when his term ended in 1950. Bill was survived by his wife Mae. She passed away in 1967, aged 88.

Upon Sheriff Dorrance's death, Hugh Cutler, Chief

Douglas County Deputy Sheriff, took over as acting Douglas County Sheriff. In January 1951, Douglas County Sheriff elect Richard E. Collins to over the Sheriff's office from acting Sheriff Cutler. Hugh would continue with the Sheriff's Office until December 1, 1951.






