Here are some general onion tips. To chop an onion without letting it "get away" cut it lengthwise in half from root to stem; peel. Place the flat cut surface down and dice lengthwise several times. Then cut crosswise. One medium onion will make approximately 1/2 cup chopped onions. If peeling onions makes you cry, try doing this job under cold running water. Onion juice is no problem if you draft your lemon squeezer. You'll find "squeezing" an onion twice as fast as grating it. For 1/4 cup or more, hold juice over glass measuring cup for exact amount.

Why are they called June Bugs?

June bugs derive their name from the fact that adult June bugs emerge from the soil at the end of spring or the beginning of the summer.

The name "June bug" refers to any of the 100 species of beetles that are related to the scarabs familiar from ancient Egyptian iconography. Other common names for the June bug include "June

beetle" and "May beetle." The common June bug is one-half to five-eighths inches long and reddishbrown in color. Being beetles, they also sport shiny wing covers, called elytra.

Females bury their eggs just below the soil surface. June bug larvae hatch within 3 to 4 weeks and feed on grass and plant roots from several months to as long as three years. In spring and early summer, these larvae — also known as grubs — grow into pupae. Within 3 weeks, these pupae mature into adult June bugs.

Speaking of the train, did you know this year marks 50 years of Old 357? A little history:



Women's Auxiliary By: Jan Moore

As promised in last month's Hot Sands, I will be giving you a report on the general meeting of the WGA4Kids. Faye & Dan Daniels, Dick and I attended the meeting which was held in Minneapolis on April 28-29. Daryl Finley joined us for the banquet on Monday evening, as he was to attend the Board of Directors meeting the next day.

FIRST AND FOREMOST: THE WGA4KIDS IS NOT DISBANDING. No matter what form of healthcare will be adopted, there will always be the need for wheelchairs. The Shrine does NOT provide wheelchairs for the kids. The WGA4KIDS provide the chairs and other mobility equipment for the children we serve at the Minneapolis location. Last year the amount of money spent for wheelchairs was \$99,359; for wheelchair repair, rental and orthoses was \$31, 856.66. For the hospital to provide mobility within the facility the WGA spend \$24, 044.48. The total for wheelchair/mobility equipment that was spent was \$155,260.14. As you can see that is a considerable amount of money. Money that all of us have helped to raise in order to fund this project. We still need your support. Tangier Auxiliary is NOT going away.

Tangier Auxiliary sent \$7,475 in donations to wheelchair fund directly and another \$500 in memorial money, which was also earmarked for the wheelchair fund. We do not send as much money as some but more than others. The highest amount sent by one auxiliary was \$39,642 and the lowest was \$83. Many of the auxiliaries exist with as few as 3 or 4 members. The point is, we each can do something. When you are giving gifts for birthdays, anniversaries or even a remembrance for a death, think of the Auxiliary. ALL money that is given to us goes directly to the wheelchair fund at WGA4KIDS. NONE of the money goes to Imperial. REMEMBER 100% DIRECTLY FOR WHEELCHAIR FUND HEADQUARTERED OUT OF WGA4KIDS.

As part of the fun, we took four raffle baskets and a Christmas quilt to be raffled. After drawing for the items we took, two of them were then auctioned to raise even more money. The wine basket from Iowa was auctioned and the person who won the raffle bought it back for \$105. Her husband was overheard as saying "I will wrap this and it's her Mother's day gift." The kitchen basket we took was raffled and the person who won

it immediately told us to auction it. When the auction for this basket was complete it had been raffled and then auctioned four times. The first auction went for \$90, the second for \$85, the third for \$75 and the final or fourth time it sold for \$100. Our kitchen basket brought a total of \$350. The garden basket we took was auctioned after the raffle and sold for \$105. The person with the winning bid then decided where the money was to go. Each time an auxiliary was named. Of course, each auxiliary will end up giving the money to the wheelchair fund. In addition to the raffle items, we sold three of the wine bottle lights, an owl tablet case and a set of card holders. With the raffle and the items sold we netted about \$450 for the wheelchair fund.

The can tab fund has done very well and has been helpful in funding the wheelchair funds. Since its inception 16 years ago the amount received from the sale of 54,520 pounds of aluminum is \$35,230.12. In 2018 5,469 pounds were sold for \$3,554,85. The lady in charge of this negotiates the price and waits for the best price possible before selling. The average price received was 65 cents per pound. The latest development is that we can still send the tabs to Minneapolis until December. We were glad to hear this information as we are only getting 25 cents per pound locally. We are thankful for all of you that so willingly and faithfully send us the tabs you have collected. At our meetings we have two or three of our guy members that carefully sift through all of the tabs before we send them to the recycling center. We find many treasures and interesting items in the tabs. KEEP THEM COMING PLEASE.

The WGA4KIDS will be accepting items until December. This is straight from the Chairman of WGA. So what do they need and what can we provide? Books for pre-teen and teens to read; activity books for younger children; colors(24 pack) and coloring books; high top or tube socks in bigger sizes for teens bright colors and patterns; socks for younger kids sizes 4-11; pillow cases (standard size) for younger kids (patterns that young kids like); gym shorts for young kids in sizes x-large through xxlarge in kids sizes and m, l, xl and xxl in adult size NO METAL OR PLASTIC; hospital gowns NO SNAPS OR METAL in 1, x1 and xx1 sizes NO PATTERNS ON MATERIAL AND PLEASE NO SEE THROUGH MATERIAL; fleece blankets are the kids favorites they can be 50 x50 for young kids and 50 x 60 for the older kids Can be tied or sewn kid friendly fleece,

sports teams, Disney characters, etc.

At the meeting each Auxiliary is required to give a report. We also handed them a check for \$2500 at that time. Just in that one 2-hour timeframe the wheelchair fund received \$39,517.25. We heard how the other auxiliaries are raising money and the membership of each of the auxiliaries. As with all other organizations they are having trouble maintaining membership . However the good news for Tangier is that in the last year we have gained 12 new members! HOORAY. About six of these folks are coming to meetings and are infusing us with new ideas and enthusiasm. Way to go!

Many of you are wondering what the new healthcare system will look like when it is a done deal. Well, at this time it is not done, but the directors are working very hard and diligently on finalizing the end result. At this time the plan is to have a clinic in Minneapolis with many outreach clinics in the area that we serve, the upper Midwest. The directors gave us several locations that are being considered and Omaha is one of those cities. Telemedicine will be a big part of the picture; by using this tool the physicians in the outreach clinics can directly communicate with our Shrine physicians and actually see the patient. This will eliminate the need for the patient and family to travel great distances for the initial contact. In the future, there may be the possibility of Shrine physicians going to the outreach areas and performing surgeries at a hospital that we would partner with in the local outreach area. In Minneapolis we partner with Gillette Hospital for Children so that our Shrine physicians can do the necessary surgery. This is a time of change and challenge and until the directors can get it finished, we will all need to be supportive and understanding of the great amount of time and thought that is going into this new model of healthcare. As a personal aside, I would like to thank Past Potentate Daryl Finley, Tangier's hospital representative and treasurer for the directors, for all the time, travel and caring he gives for the kids we serve.

I know that this is a long report, but I feel that it will help you to understand what is needed, what we can do and what some of the changes may be. Hang in there, we will get to the end and when we do it will be a more efficient, cost effective, and yet a better way to treat the kids that we care so deeply about.

After a great deal of planning and searching, we plan to move to a new building in the City Place Development in Woodbury, Minnesota, an eastern suburb of St. Paul, Minnesota, by the summer of 2020. This move is a step in our transition to an outpatient clinic model.

Construction of our new site will begin later this summer and continue into the middle of next year. Our current site will be sold as we transition to the new site.

Developing a new site is a special opportunity to create a patient-centered environment for the modern era. Shriners Healthcare for Children's new facility will allow staff to provide a wide range of services for children with orthopaedic conditions including:

- **Clinic Services:** providing a family-centered, team approach to care. Patients will see specialty physicians, nurses, therapists and other pediatric-trained specialists in an environment designed for children.
- Child Life: providing families with support during appointments through play and anxiety coping activities. The Child Life program also offers over twenty (20) camps and programs to meet the physical and emotional needs of children with orthopaedic conditions.
- **Radiology:** providing standard x-ray service as well as EOS, which provides 3-D, fullbody imaging with up to 85 percent lower radiation.
- **Rehabilitation:** providing physical and occupational therapy to help children build skills, strength and mobility needed for everyday activities.
 - Scoliosis Specific Exercise a specialized physical therapy program that uses exercises, stretching and breathing to improve a patient's scoliotic posture.
- Orthotics and Prosthetics: offering orthotic and prosthetic services specifically for children, including
 upper and lower extremity prosthetic care, scoliosis bracing and a broad spectrum of pediatric orthotic
 services.
- **Telehealth:** including telehealth capabilities that enable video connection to other remote sites across the region, creating more opportunities for access to children in need of pediatric orthopaedic services. This capability enhances Shriners Hospitals for Children's reputation as the largest network of specialized pediatric orthopaedic and burn telehealth sites in the world.

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
