Corvette College. Let's cover a part of a Corvette many other car owners see quite a bit. Taillights. When the Corvette was born it had single taillights on each rear quarter panel which were called "rocket taillights." In 1956 the taillights were still round but inset into a chrome cove in the quarter panel. In 1961 the Corvette legacy of two round taillights set into the back panel above the bumper began. With most Chevrolets going to three taillights on each side it was somewhat common to see a third taillight added to quite a few Corvettes. There were even howto articles on this topic in many automotive magazines from the sixties. Even when the Corvette was completely redesigned for 1968 the engineers knew not to mess with the pair of round red lights on the car's rump and they stayed pretty much unchanged. Except larger, through the next redesign in 1984. 1990 is where things started to go a little havwire. There were still four taillights on the corvette but they weren't exactly round. They were kind of rectangular with large radius corners. The next generation Corvette in 1998, the taillights went to four ovals and the one after that (2005) they were round again. The all new C7 Corvette of 2014 brought a change that just doesn't sit right with many Corvette enthusiasts. The car wore what looks like four lights in two housings that angle down on the outside edges. Kind of Camaro like a lot of people say. The new mid-engine C8 taillights play off of the C7's. I think it is a pretty good bet that the taillights on some future model Corvette will once again be round in one form or another.






