







Matthew has made an outstanding impact on his community. We are proud to announce that he has been chosen as a recipient of this year's Rainbow of Hope award from Shriners Hospitals for Children — Twin Cities. The award recognizes three current or former patients for the contributions they have made to their communities.

Matthew was born with ectrodactyly of the hands and feet, a condition in which part or all of the fingers and toes are missing. At age 5, Matthew had bilateral Symes amputation surgery at the Twin Cities Hospital and was fitted with prosthetic legs that year. "My first set had vintage cars on them and I used to imagine that they'd make me go fast," he said. Matthew started rehabilitation in a wheelchair, then moved to a walker and that same summer was playing t-ball, surpassing all expectations. "Doctors told my mom that I wouldn't be able to walk and Shriners Hospitals for Children changed that," he said.

Matthew is not only resilient, but incredibly kind in giving back to the community. In 2012, he set a goal to collect 100 handmade cards to deliver to children in the hospital. But with the help of Operation Write Home, he was able to deliver over 1,000 cards, donated from all over the country and as far as Australia. He also recently ran a pillowcase drive, collecting almost 800 handmade pillowcases. "Matthew has a heart for service," his mom Ashley said. "He feels compelled to help people whenever he can."

Matthew says he doesn't see his hands or legs as obstacles and can do anything he sets his mind to. His positive attitude and remarkable perseverance make Matthew a role model to others. The Twin Cities Shriners Hospital is proud to honor Matthew with the Rainbow of Hope award. "I feel honored having won the award because there are so many other kids who have done amazing things and it's humbling to be considered a part of that group," he said.





Tangier Shrine Medallion Award Program



The following list details the current means by which a Tangier Shrine Noble may earn points towards receiving either a medallion and/or diamond or ruby jewels for a medallion, once presented. This list is consistent with the guidelines set forth by Shriners International in Tampa, FL. While it is subject to change, suitable notification will be given when or if changes are made. It is important to note that the burden of proof lies with the Noble seeking a medallion or jewel. A Shrine Medallion Award request form has been designed and is available at the Tangier Shrine office, the Samsar, or from the leader of each unit or club. Any Noble desiring to be considered for a medallion or jewel shall complete the form and submit to the Samsar or Tangier Shrine Office. Any additional documentation, where required, shall be the responsibility of the Noble.

General Award Program

Blue Lodge Top-Line Signer	100 Points
Shrine Top-Line Signer	250 Points

The following list is the progressive order in which the medallion, colored ropes, and jewels will be awarded:

First 1000 Points:	Tangier Shrine Medallion / Green Rope
Second 600 Points:	1 st Diamond
Third 600 Points:	2 nd Diamond
Fourth 600 Points:	3 rd Diamond / Yellow Rope
Fifth 600 Points:	4 th Diamond
Sixth 600 Points:	5 th Diamond / Red Rope
Final 800 Points:	All Rubies

In each case of Top-Line Signers, verifiable records must be obtained by the Noble seeking the award. In those cases involving the Shrine, a simple computer records check will generally verify the required information. However, in the case of Blue Lodge Top-Line Signers, it shall be the sole responsibility of the Noble to obtain an original letter on respective Blue Lodge letterhead signed by the Lodge Secretary. The letter shall contain the following: Name(s) of the Brother(s) and the date(s) Raised to a Master Mason. Such letter will be attached to the aforementioned Shrine Medallion Award request form and will be submitted to the Tangier Shrine Samsar or office for appropriate action.

All questions concerning the Shrine Medallion Award Program shall be addressed to the Tangier Shrine Samsar. In the event of disputes or unsupported documentation, the Samsar, in consultation with the Tangier Divan, shall make the final decision in such matters.


