The parking lot will be tricky this month as we start phase two on the south side, but it will be great when they get it done.

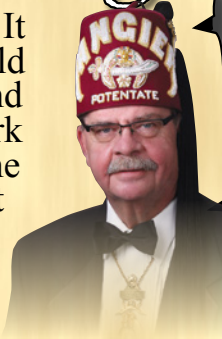
If you are looking to join a Unit, the Oriental Band is looking for new members. Contact the office for more information.

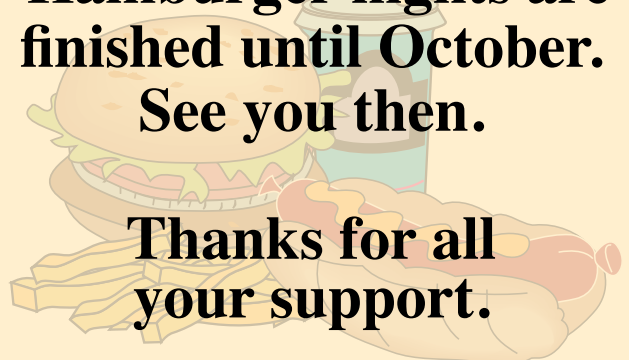

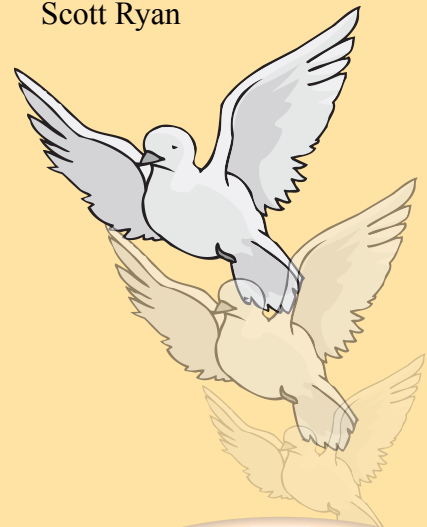

HOW TO STORE VIDALIA SWEET ONIONS: Vidalia onions tend to bruise easily. The key to maintaining their sweet goodness is to keep them cool, dry and separated. Try these storage methods: If you're not going to use them immediately, wrap each one separately in paper towels and refrigerate or place in the legs of clean, sheer pantyhose. Tie a knot between each Vidalia and cut above the knot when you want one. Store in a cool dry place Or arrange the onions separately on elevated racks or screens and keep in a cool, dry place.

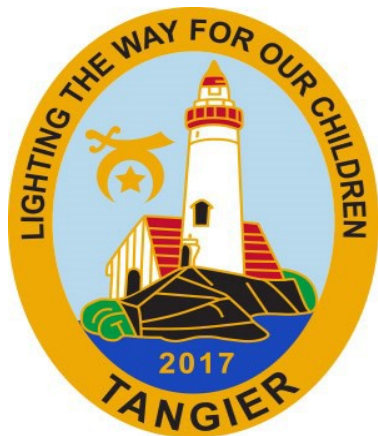

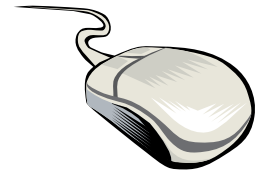
