Try these storage methods: If you're not going to use them immediately, wrap each one separately in paper towels and refrigerate or place in the legs of clean, sheer pantyhose. Tie a knot between each Vidalia and cut above the knot when you want one. Store in a cool dry place Or arrange the onions separately on elevated racks or screens and keep in a cool, dry place.




Parade season has arrived!






We haven't had an update on Tom's Golf Outing. I guess you'll have to attend a meeting to find out the details.


